Nighttime Bicycling Safety

- Use a bright headlight.
- A flashing red rear light is preferred; a reflector is permitted if visible.
- Wear reflective clothing.
- Always wear your helmet.



The New Broadway Bicycle/Pedestrian Safety Zone

The City of Fargo has designated the downtown section of Broadway as a Bicycle/Pedestrian Safety Zone. The Zone includes Broadway's street and sidewalks and extends from 6th Avenue North to NP Avenue.



Bicyclists -

- Ride on the street and obey rules of the road for vehicles.
- Use appropriate hand signals for turning and stopping.
- Ride close to the center lane to maximize visibility.
- Wear a helmet.

Motorists -

- Allow bicyclists to integrate into traffic.
- Drive carefully and watch for pedestrians, bicyclists, and vehicles backing out of parking spaces.

On Sidewalks -

- Bicyclists must walk their bikes in the Bicycle/Pedestrian Safety Zone and obey rules for pedestrians.
- Cross streets only at crosswalks.
- Obey traffic signals.


