- POP coupons are available at many downtown businesses. A coupon provides one hour of FREE parking at a POP lot or a one-way MAT bus ride.
- Four-hour time zones (FREE)
- "After hours" parking is FREE in all POP lots between 6 p.m. and 8 a.m. with the exception of special events.

## Downtown Residential Parking Permit Program

Downtown residential parking permits allow residents to park on city streets and not be penalized by time-zone restrictions. This program is available on designated streets and in publicly owned parking lots between the hours of 6 p.m. and 8 a.m.

To obtain a permit, you must submit a completed application and be a resident of the downtown area. The fee for this permit is \$25 per month. Designated streets are identified on the brochure you receive with your permit. Call 241-1474 for details.

## Bike Lockers/Parking

Bike lockers are available for rent from the City of Fargo at the US Bank ramp, 2nd Avenue North lot and the GTC garage. Contact Parking Service at 235-1618 for details.

## Skyway Hours

The Skyway provides a convenient connection between parking, restaurants, retail stores and entertainment venues. The Skyway is open for use between 7 a.m. and 6 p.m. weekdays, Saturdays and during events at the Civic Center.



## Time Zones

On-street **time zone** parking is in effect from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday through Saturday. Outside of these hours and on City of Fargo holidays, the **time zone** restrictions do not apply.

The **time zone** starts when the vehicle is parked. The City of Fargo uses electronic devices to identify the locations of parked vehicles. Chalk is no longer used. A vehicle parked for longer than the posted **time zone** allows, may receive multiple citations for each separate violation.

## “Short Move”

Moving your vehicle from one space to another on the same block does not restart the **time zone** parking period. When the posted time-limit restriction has elapsed and the vehicle remains parked or is parked on the same block, the vehicle will be considered stationary and eligible for a parking ticket.

## Night Parking

**Parking is FREE** in all off-street lots in the downtown area between the hours of 6 p.m. and 8 a.m.

Streets within the central business district, which includes the area from the Red River west to University Drive and from 5th Avenue North to 1st Avenue South, have overnight parking restrictions throughout the year. Vehicles or trailers parked in violation of overnight parking restrictions may be ticketed or impounded by the Police Department.

East/West Avenues: on-street parking is restricted between the early-morning hours of 2 a.m. and 7 a.m. on Monday, Wednesday, Friday and Sunday.

North/South Streets: on-street parking is restricted between the early-morning hours of 2 a.m. and 7 a.m. on Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday.
